## Guidance on infection control in schools and other childcare settings Public Health of England [PHE]

Infection, Illness or Complaint	Minimum Exclusion Period
Prescribed Medic	ation or Medical Treatment
Prescribed antibiotics	24 hours from first dosage administered to ensure no side effects occur and child feeling better
Immunisation, vaccination, injection	24 hours from injection/ nasal spray in case of possible allergic reaction or side effects
Rashes a	and Skin Infections
Athlete's foot	None
Chickenpox	5 days from the onset rash or until all the vesicles have crusted over and child is well *Pregnancy Vulnerable*
Cold sores [Herpes simplex]	None
Impetigo	Until lesions are crusted and healed over, or 48 hours after starting antibiotic treatment
German Measles & Measles	4 days from onset of rash *Pregnancy Vulnerable*
Hand, foot and mouth	None, unless child really unwell
Molluscum Contagiosum	None
Ringworm	None, unless medication required which will be 24 hours from first dosage administered to ensure no side effects occur
Roseola [infantum]	None
Scabies	Treatment required, 24 hours from first dosage administered to ensure no side effects occur and child feeling better  *Pregnancy Vulnerable*
Scarlet fever	Treatment required, 24 hours from first dosage administered to ensure no side effects occur and child feeling better
Slapped cheek/fifth disease. Parvovirus B19	None once rash has developed
Shingles	Exclude only if rash is weeping and cannot be covered  *Pregnancy Vulnerable*
Diarrhoea	and Vomiting Illness
Diarrhoea and/or vomiting	48 hours from last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting



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E. Coli O157 VTEC Typhoid [and paratyphoid]	48 hours from last episode of diarrhoea or vomiting.	
[enteric fever] Shigella [Dysentery]	Further exclusion may be required for some children	
[ement fever] Onigena [Dysentery]	until they are no longer excreting	
Cryptosporidiosis	48 hours from last episode of diarrhoea

Flu [influenza]	Until recovered	
Tuberculosis	Consult local PHE centre	
Whooping cough	48 hours from starting antibiotic treatment, or 21	
	days from onset of illness if no antibiotic treatment

Corona virus - Covid 19	Stay at home and avoid contact until they no longer	
	have fever or until they feel better.

Diphtheria	Exclusion essential, consult local PHE centre	
Glandular fever	None	
Head lice	Treatment requested where live lice have been seen	
Hepatitis A	Exclude until 7 days after onset of jaundice or	
	symptoms	
Hepatitis B, C, HIV/AIDS	None	
Meningococcal meningitis/septicaemia	Until fully recovered	
Meningitis due to other bacteria	Until fully recovered	
Meningitis viral	None

Mumps	5 days from onset of rash/swelling	
Threadworm	None, unless medication required which will be 24	
	hours from first dosage administered to ensure no	
	side effects occur	
Tonsillitis	None, unless medication required which will be 24	
	hours from first dosage administered to ensure no
